
Exporting single articles

- Open the article and Click on the **Cite this article** (part of the title details)

Download citation

Download a citation file in RIS format that can be imported by citation management software including EndNote, ProCite, RefWorks and Reference Manager.

Choose format: ORIS BibTex RefWorks Direct Export

Choose options: Citation Citation & abstract Citation & references

First tick the articles you want and then click on the **“Download citation”** link at the top of the results (below the tabs).



TIP – Ignore the big green export search results button – it doesn't work.

It doesn't open RefWorks in a new tab, it just overwrites the Taylor and Francis screen, so save your search to get back to.
